
Right on course . . .

The newly reconstructed Kensington Track at Sydney's Royal Randwick Racecourse was officially opened early October with the first race meeting held on the NSW public Holiday Monday.

From all accounts the meeting was a terrific success and a huge amount of media attention has heaped praise on the new surface.

The S1.7M track project was planned as part of The Randwick Racecourse's recent major redevelopment and included new members stands and facilities, all-up valued at around \$100Million.

The track underwent a full reconstruction by Strathayr with their world-renowned high infiltration-rate track profile coupled with new Village Green Kikuyu Turf, supplied and installed by Collins Sports Turf of Sydney.

Comments leading up to racing on the new track were pointing towards the surface getting good reviews however the fallout from the first meeting has been quite remarkable.
